From the Rear Commodore ☆ Doug Corbett

I turned off the air and opened the windows last night for the first time this summer. To me, that signals that a change in season is upon us. Indeed, by the time you read this, our final regatta, the Leukemia Cup, will be in the books and the summer sailing season will be over ☹

But before you go crying in your beer, Bill Trost, our esteemed Sailing Director, is busy trying to drum up enthusiasm among the kids and parents to extend the sailing season another couple of weeks. He and several of our instructors are anxious to keep teaching and we are in search of kids that want to keep sailing!

It just needs to be funded. Our sailing payroll budget is based on an 8 week season which ends on Saturday, August 15th. So to get this extension off the ground, we would only need to charge approximately \$50 per week per child for 3 hours a day and 3 days a week to cover the cost of the instructors. (Based on 5 or 6 children per instructor). Please notify Bill if you are interested. We'll need about 10-12 kids to make this work.

If you're an adult that wants to keep sailing, I'd recommend that you work directly with an instructor or Bill to arrange for a private lesson on the weekends.

On another note, I'm pleased to report that we sold the Skiff to Deebold's (Cove Marina). We put \$500 in the bank and avoided having to pay an outstanding repair bill of \$275 and another estimated \$650 in work to get it running again in order to sell. That boat capsized the first week we owned it (many years ago) and has never run properly since. It was unreliable, top heavy, and has been the source of much frustration and outgoing repair dollars year after year. I'm sure my successor will be thrilled not to have to deal with it, although we'll need to do some fund raisers to generate the cash necessary to replace it with a more appropriate craft.

I'd like to extend my heartfelt thanks to all the instructors and Bill for all their efforts to make this season a memorable one for the kids and to the many adults who came out on the weekends to sail. That's a trend I'd love to see continue. We have Sunfish and the Capri 14' that are perfect for adults. I hope you all enjoyed the summer sailing season as much as I have.

And thanks to all the volunteers who offered their time and expertise to put on a few really good regattas. I was told when I was elected that everyone would help, and I can't tell you how grateful I am that all of you did!
