We are fortunate to have two enthusiastic Flag officers that will do a great job in their respective roles this year – Brian, as the returning Rear Commodore, proved his seaworthiness last year and is intent on building on that success. Hugh, as your new Vice Commodore, is brimming with ideas to stimulate the social scene and keep the clubhouse active all summer with something for everyone. I am really looking forward to a memorable summer of 2017 at the club and hope you are too.

That enables me to focus my attention on 5 other priorities over the coming year and I'll be in search of member support to make progress in these areas.

1. **Membership:** We'll need to provide incredible value to existing members so that they become our best salespeople and bring others into the club. We need a strategy to reach out to past members and encourage them to come back. And finally we need to find ways to tap into sources of new members and be able to show how membership at BYC is enriching and fun.
2. **Communication:** it's clear to me that members like to get their BYC news in lots of different ways. (John Gibbons did a weekly phone call, Jimmy Burns did a magnetic calendar) - We need to utilize all the tools available to streamline the process and get out the news and messages efficiently and in a way members want to receive it (telephone, mail, email, google docs, etc.)
3. **Standardization of processes:** one thing is for sure, in an organization in which the leadership changes every year, there is a need for a central location for information and "how to" manuals.

4. **Marketing:** We have a brand new website that offers plenty of room to add content. We also had a great presence in the local paper this past year. We have a new clubhouse that could and should generate substantial incremental funds from rentals if marketed well.
5. **Fiscal Responsibility:** As a Trustee back in the 90's, I recall learning about the work of the long term finance committee and being impressed that they had the foresight to put money away for a "rainy day". Thanks to their efforts and that of previous administrations, we were able to afford a new bulkhead when the time came and currently are on stable financial ground.

I'm pleased to say that your Flag officers, Treasurer, and Board of Trustees are all in agreement and committed to a path to get the clubhouse loans paid back and become debt free as quickly as possible. This is why membership growth and clubhouse rentals will be my 2 top priorities. Tom Parvesse has also re-established the funding of a separate account for long term capital expenditures, like the docks. Know that as a team, we have an open-door policy and welcome constructive criticism, compliments, and especially volunteers!

In conclusion, I'd like to say that it's an honor and a privilege to join the ranks of BYC Commodores. When I look at the portraits up in the gallery on the 2nd floor, it gives me pause to know that I now shoulder the responsibility that they all carried so well. I take that responsibility seriously and am thrilled to "carry the torch" this year and be leading the way along with such a talented team made up of Brian, Hugh, Tom and the Trustees. I'd like to thank all of them for their service to the club and to all of you for all you do for BYC.

Club Rentals: We're getting some new interest in the club for rentals! Please remember that the club is the most spectacular venue on the island and available at an incredibly reasonable price. Prices are based

on four hour blocks: Members can bring in their own Food and Beverages or use Club liquor. Non-members must bring their own F & B and also must hire a Supervisor recommended by the club and pay \$100 for cleaning fee. There is no better rental and no better view!

Memorial Day thru Labor Day – BYC is available for rent on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday evenings after 5:00 pm. The summer rental fee is \$500 per night for 4 hours. Extra hours can be requested at \$100 per hour. Extra hours are not guaranteed if not agreed upon in advance.

September through May – BYC is available for rent on all days and evenings of the week.

\$400 for 4 hours in April, May, September, and October
