Thanks so much, it was fantastic!

Sunday afternoon was the 2017 BYC Sailing Camp, a wonderful initiative that has 3 objectives: to carry out our mission to introduce youngsters to the sport of sailing, to give back to the community, and to drive membership. Sue Ferguson and Maria Miller planned a great event and welcomed over 30 kids (parents and grandparents) to BYC to get out on the water to sail. Welcome to summer and the sailing program for all ages and skills at your BYC. We are just finishing our second week of the program and I am thrilled to report that we have 44 junior sailors in the program this year and most importantly 16 young sailors who are new to the BYC program and are first time sailors. This is a major increase from last year and it allows us to offer more and do more for all of our sailors. For example, the higher interest in the program has allowed us to have a weekend junior program on Saturdays for the first time in years. Additionally, we offer adult and family lessons by appointment as long as you contact me or Bill Trost, our experienced sailing director who is back for his third year overseeing the program.

As a reminder, our junior schedule runs Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and now Saturday for kids who may not be here every day during the week. The beginners are in the morning and the intermediate and experienced kids are in the afternoon. For specific weekly details that are up to date check the BYC website or the sailing google calendar.

On Thursdays, the travel racing team known as BOLT (Brigantine optimist and laser team) travel to one of our fellow South Jersey Yacht clubs known as MAYRA. Last Thursday was the first regatta at Avalon and

we had several sailors who braved winds blowing up to 25 mph. Because of the high winds, only two races were completed. Keenan Stahl, Tristan Parsio, Cayden Parsio, Lauren Murray and Claire Miller all made the trek to Avalon to race. And Patrick Murray raced his Laser on his off day from teaching sailing. This Thursday the sailors will head to Wildwood for the next MAYRA regatta.

Any young sailors who are interested in learning to race in these large regattas should let me or Bill Trost know so that we can help you through the steps to racing in these amazing events that can have over 100 boats on the course at the same time. You should put July 20th and August 2nd on your calendar because these are two days where BYC will host one of these large regattas and where your kids can experience racing in a big regatta for the first time. And for the beginner sailors, they should at least come to the club to watch so they can be ready in one or two years! And maybe you can help us as a volunteer during these days where we need help for managing traffic to making lunches to running races.

And there is more... this Friday night July 7th is the first bi-weekly Friday night family races which is open to all boats and all sailors of all ages and skills. Racing will begin at 5pm and it coincides with the casual Friday night social. So come down with your sailing gear and then roll into the Sunset bar and food truck for dinner.
